

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
Important Safety Information

This manual contains very important information about the safe installation and operation of the fireplace. Read and understand all instructions carefully before installing and operating the fireplace. Failure to follow these instructions may result in possible fire hazard and will void the warranty.

Read all instructions before using this heater!

- This heater is hot when in use. To avoid burns,
 DO NOT let bare skin touch hot surfaces.
 If provided, use handles when moving this heater. Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, papers, clothes, and curtains at least 39 inches (1 m) from the front of the heater and keep them away from the sides and rear.
- Extreme caution is necessary when any heater is used by or near children or invalids and whenever the heater is left operating and unattended.
- DO NOT operate any heater with a damaged cord or plug or after the heater malfunctions, has been dropped or damaged in any manner. Disconnect power at service panel and have heater inspected by a reputable electrician before reusing.
- INDOOR use only! NEVER use this heater outdoors! Doing so may result in electric shock!
- To disconnect heater, turn controls to off, and turn off power to heater circuit at main disconnect panel.
- DO NOT run power cord under carpeting.
 DO NOT cover power cord with throw rugs, runners, or similar coverings. DO NOT route power cord under furniture or appliances.
 Arrange power cord away from traffic area, and where it will not be tripped over.
- DO NOT insert or allow foreign objects to enter any ventilation or exhaust opening, as this may cause electric shock or fire, or damage the heater.



- To prevent a possible fire, DO NOT block air intakes or exhaust in any manner.
- A heater has hot and arcing or sparking parts inside. **DO NOT** use it in areas where gasoline, paint, or flammable liquids are used or stored.
- Use this heater only as described in this manual. Any other use not recommended by the manufacturer may cause fire, electric shock, or injury to persons.
- This appliance MUST be grounded.
- ALWAYS plug heaters directly into a wall outlet/receptacle. NEVER use with an extension cord or relocatable power tap (outlet/power strip).
- NEVER use this heater in bathrooms, laundry rooms, or any other location where the heater could fall into a bathtub or pool, become damp, or come in contact with water.
- AVOID FIRE! Regularly inspect all air vents to make sure they are free from dust, lint, or other blockage. Unplug the unit and clean with a vacuum ONLY. DO NOT rinse or get wet.

Important Safety Information

/!\ WARNING

DO NOT depend on the ON/OFF switch as the sole means of disconnecting power when servicing or moving the heater. Always unplug the power cord.

/!\ WARNING

Reduce the risk of fire or electric shock— DO NOT use this heater with any solid state speed control devices.

- NEVER hang this unit on a wall directly below an electrical outlet.
- For residential use only! **NOT** for commercial use! Any commercial or public use of this heater voids all warranties, and could cause injury.
- This product is not intended to be a primary heat source. It is for supplemental heat only.
- Risk of electric shock! DO NOT OPEN! No user-serviceable parts inside!
- NEVER modify this heater. Doing so could result in personal injury or property damage. Modification of this fireplace completely voids all warranties.
- **ALWAYS** turn this heater off before unplugging it from the outlet.
- ALWAYS disconnect this unit from the power supply before performing any assembly or cleaning, or before relocating the electric fireplace.
- **NEVER** leave this heater unattended. **ALWAYS** unplug this heater when not in use.
- **ALWAYS** store this heater in a dry location. **NEVER** use the fireplace if it has become wet.
- **ONLY** use this heater on a 120V AC 15-Amp or 240V AC 15-Amp circuit. **NEVER** overload the circuit. If this heater trips the circuit breaker, unplug all other appliances on the same circuit before the next use. Avoid plugging

- other appliances into the same circuit as this heater.
- NEVER plug this heater into an outlet that is old, cracked, or has any loose wires or connections. Plugging this heater into a faulty outlet could result in electric arcing within the outlet that could cause the outlet to overheat or catch fire.
- ALWAYS check your heater cord and plug connections with each use!
- MAKE SURE the plug fits tight in the outlet! Faulty wall outlet connections or loose plugs can cause the outlet to overheat.
- Heaters draw more current than small appliances. Overheating may occur even if it has not occurred with the use of other appliances.
- During use check frequently to see if the plug outlet or faceplate is **HOT**! If the outlet or faceplate is **HOT**, discontinue use immediately and have a qualified electrician inspect and/ or replace the faulty outlets.


Pack Content

- 1. Unpack the fireplace carefully and make sure that the appliance is intact with no signs of damage caused by transport and no part has been exposed to water. If in doubt, do not use the appliance and contact your retailer.
- 2. Keep plastic wrapping away from children.
- 3. Save the original packaging as this may be required in the event of service complaint with product.
- 4. Check that all parts are removed from the packing.






Fronts & Backing Plates

• PE2CFV—Clearview Front. Offers minimal coverage on three sides of the fireplace, 21" wide.





IMPORTANT!

CAST FRONTS INSTALLATION

The cast fronts, when installed, will need to be sitting on the hearth or shelf to support their weight. The fireplace SHOULD NOT support the cast front.

The surface of the hearth/shelf will need to be level and flush with the bottom of the PE2 fireplace.

An anti-tipping bracket is supplied with the PE2CBK Cast Front Bracket Kit to restrain the PE2 fireplace from tipping forward due to the weight of the casting—see installation manual provided with the kit.

To ensure the casting fits tight against the wall finish, it is recommended to also further secure the PE2 fireplace within the cavity using metal strapping or similar.

PREPARATION BEFORE INSTALLATION

Tools

A screwdriver, a spirit level and drill will be needed.

Appliance Location

Your new electric fireplace may be installed either in an existing fireplace cavity or framed into the wall. However, when choosing a location, ensure that the general instructions are followed:

- For best result, install out of direct sunlight, away from damp locations.
- The appliance should be connected to an grounded electrical outlet and it must be easily accessible to allow disconnection.

The following is only given as a general guide because it can be installed in different ways.

This appliance is intended to be installed either in an existing fireplace cavity or into a built-in cavity.

Provided you ensure electric connections are safely made in accordance with the codes, various materials can be used for the framework and cladding. Ensure the framing and wall finish are self-supporting and

do not rely on the appliance to support framing or wall finish. Consideration should be made to soften the internal surface of any cladding to minimize that amplification of noise.

Installing Into an Existing Fireplace


When the appliance is to be fitted into or against an open flue or chimney, it is important that the flue/chimney is blocked, for example with 'Rockwool' to avoid a negative air pull that may oppose the heater fan.

In addition, the chimney should be cleaned, including the cavity, ash dump to avoid dust/ashes entering into the appliance or being circulated into the room.

Clean and Insulate Existing Fireplace Cavity

A few points must be considered before inserting the PE2 into an existing fireplace cavity including minimum cavity dimensions shown below.

- Clean Fireplace and Chimney. Have the chimney swept and the fireplace cavity including ash dumps and clean-outs cleaned before installing the PE2 fireplace. Any creosote or soot residue remaining in the fireplace cavity chimney or clean-out may cause odors or stains once the PE2 insert is installed. Consult with chimney sweep for information on how best to clean.
- Existing Dampers. Close off the dampers and cleanouts.
- Ash Retaining Curbs. Some fireplace (particularly factory-built) have a raised curb at the front edge to retain ashes. Check the dimensions carefully to ensure the PE2 will fit behind any raised curb (some curbs may be removed separately from the refractory base).


Installing Into a Built-in Cavity

• **Prepare the framing.** As a general guide only, see picture below.

NOTE

Ensure a firm flat positioning of the appliance to avoid vibration and movement of the appliance after finishing.

• **Wall finish.** Hard surfaces can amplify sound. Consider adding some underlay or similar to the inside surface of the wall finish.



Preparation

Connect the Mood Ligting Cable

The Mood Lighting is optional and sold separately. Use only the Valor brand.

Other brands may not be suitable and can void the warranty.



The connector for the mood lighting cable is on the back of the appliance, near the power cord outlet. To connect it, follow the instructions supplied with the mood lighting cable package.



/!\ WARNING

DO NOT EXCEED the Mood Lighting power indicated above and in the section Specifications, otherwise a short-circuit could compromise the appliance function.



Preparation

Connect the Power Supply

This appliance can operate on 120V or 240V. To change voltage from 120V to 240V, access switch at the rear of the appliance.


The power connection can be made with the 6 feet Mains Cable provided or alternatively it can be hard wired by unscrewing and removing the Access Plate, the Mains Cable and retention grommet. The access plate can be repositioned so that the 22mm hole sits over the cutout in back of appliance.

The 22mm hole can be used for hard wiring access with a strain relief clamp.


Hard Wiring

















IMPORTANT! 240V wiring: Bring L1 and L2 all the way to the terminal blocks, do not tie them together outside of the unit.


NOTE: A strain relief is required where the incoming wires pass through the metal plate.


Prepare the Appliance

Removing the front glass panel

1. Stick the small magnetic handle just above the center of one of the appliance's side panel. The side panels are held in place by magnets.




2. Pull the panel towards the center of the appliance then grab it and remove it. Alternately, you can pull out the side panels by inserting you finger in the cutout at the top of each panel.




3. Repeat with the other side panel.

4. On the bottom horizontal panel in front of the glass, remove one screw at each end. Lift the panel out.




Preparation

5. Using the suction cup (orange) provided to support the middle of the glass panel and lift the panel upwards and pull it forwards as its lower edge. Carefully lift glass away as shown below.



6. Very carefully pull the glass bottom first and then slide down top to disengage it from the top strip. Set aside in a secure location to avoid damaging it.



Installation

Appliance

Slide the fireplace into the cavity of the existing prepared fireplace or into the built-in framing.

Plug in the fireplace or hard-wire it. See details under *Connect Power Supply* in this manual.

Check that the power functions using the appliance's manual control panel—see page 23.

Fuel Bed

Once the appliance is in final place, install the fuel bed. It helps to turn the fireplace's lights on when placing the fuel bed components to verify the glow of the logs/coals and see their details. See the appliance's control panel—page 23—or use the remote control—see "Fuel Bed/Glowing Log/Sync" on page 25.

Reinstall the Glass

In reverse order, reinstall the glass on the fireplace, being very careful when manipulating it—see page 20 for reference.

- 1. Slide the glass pane behind the top black strip then push the bottom in place.
- 2. Reinstall the bottom horizontal panel securing it with two screws.
- 3. Reinstall the side magnetic panels, placing the top first, then the bottom.

Front/Backing Plate

See Accessories section on pages 11-15 in this manual for Fronts and Backing Plates Dimensions. Install the choosen front and optional backing plate according to the installation instructions provided with each kit.

Manual Control

BFFORF OPFRATION



/!\ WARNING

DO NOT operate the appliance if it is damaged or malfunctions. If you suspect the appliance is damaged or malfunctions, call a qualified service engineer to inspect the appliance, and replace any part of the electrical system if necessary before reusing.



∕!\ WARNING

To reduce the risk of fire, keep textiles, curtains, and any other flammable material a minimum distance of 39 inches (1 meter) from the air outlet.

MAKE SURE the plug fits tight in the outlet. Faulty wall outlet connections or loose plugs can cause the outlet to overheat.

DO NOT disconnect the power at the mains supply whilst the appliance is running. Use the functions on the remote to turn the fire off and ensure the mains switch has been moved to the off position before disconnecting.

The appliance can be operated conveniently in 3 different ways:

- manually,
- · by remote control handset, or
- with the dedicated iOS/Android app.

MANUAL CONTROL



MANUAL SWITCH

Press "I" to turn on power to the appliance; press "O" to turn it off.

STAND-BY

Press to turn on the last used settings without any heat. Also, places the appliance into standby mode with all features turned off.

FLAME

Press repeatedly to cycle through 6 fire preset modes and 3 user defined presets if programmed.

HEATER

Press to cycle through the heat output options. LOW-ON-OFF-AUTO.

WIFI


Press to turn WiFi on or off. An illuminated LFD on the button indicates that WiFi is turned on. Hold button for 3 seconds to enter device pairing mode.

To Turn OFF Audible Beep

Each time a button is pressed on the appliance or on the remote control, an audible beep is emitted. To turn off this feature, keep pressing the button **FLAME** for 3 seconds until you hear two beeps.

Remote Control

REMOTE CONTROL



NOTE

The remote control handset must be left in the same room as the appliance because it houses the thermostat that regulates heat output. Also, when using the APP, the remote must also be in the same room and have batteries fitted and working to ensure accurate temperature control.

Remote Control Setup

The communication frequency between the appliance and remote has already been set up. If you have difficulty with the remote communicating with the appliance, press and hold the Standby button on the appliance until you hear two beeps, then release the button. Press the Power button \bullet on the remote control handset and you will hear one beep. The remote is connected with the appliance.

MY Flame

Press > to enter My Flame adjustment screen.

Press ← and → to select 6 My Flame modes (+3 user defined presets if programmed).

There are 3 preset slots allocated for the user to save personalised settings. Simply choose the flame and its fuel bed color, the brightness level and downlight. Once you have selected your desired combination, press and hold the My Flame button for 3 seconds until the LCD displays My Flame save to 7.

Press – or + buttons to select a slot number between 7 and 9. Press and hold for 3 seconds to confirm the preset.

Flame Effect &

Press once to enter the flame setting mode.

Press \leftarrow and \rightarrow buttons to select 16 different flame effects and OFF setting.

Press – and + buttons to select 5 levels of brightness.

Remote Control

Fuel Bed/Glowing Log/Sync * ≝ ⇔

Press **once** until **%** shows on the screen to enter the **fuel bed** setting mode.

Press ← and → buttons to select 9 different fuel bed colors and OFF setting. The ninth is the color cycle mode.

Press — and + buttons to select the 5 levels of brightness.

Press **twice** until \(\sime\) shows on the screen to enter the **glowing log** setting mode.

Press ← and → buttons to select 9 different fuel bed colors and OFF setting. The ninth is the color cycle mode.

Press — and + buttons to select the 5 levels of brightness.

Press **three times** until ∞ shows on the screen to enter the **sync** mode.

Press ← and → buttons to adjust the fuel bed effects and glowing logs effects simultaneously.

Press – and + buttons to select the 5 levels of brightness.

Down Light/Mood Light ★ ※

Note: If mood lights are not connected, please ensure the brightness is set to zero.

Press **once** until * shows on the screen to enter the down light setting mode.

Press \leftarrow and \rightarrow buttons to select 2 different down light color and OFF setting.

Press – and + buttons to select 5 levels of brightness.

Press **twice** until **>**● shows on the screen to enter the mood light setting mode.

Press ← and → buttons to select 13 different ambient light colors and OFF setting. (The 13th is the color cycle mode).

Press – and + buttons to select 5 levels of brightness.

Crackling Sound •

Press • to open sound effect menu.

Press \leftarrow and \rightarrow buttons to turn on/off the sound effect.

Press – and + buttons to adjust 5 levels of volume.

Heater Mode w

Press ss to cycle through the heat output options: LOW-ON-OFF-AUTO (AUTO only functions with the mobile application, once it has been programmed).

To switch between °C/°F, press and hold ← or → button for 3 seconds.

Press – and + buttons to adjust the temperature you want the room to reach, from 5 to 40 °C (41 to 104 °F).

NOTE: It is normal for the fan heater to stop running for periods of time. This happens because the room temperature is at or above the temperature set on the remote control.

NOTE: This setting is only for operating in normal mode. It allows the appliance to go into standby after a set period of time.

Press **▼** to cycle through the settings from 0.5 hour to 10 hours, and then OFF.

Adaptive Start Control

Learning from the previous heating cycle enables the appliance to judge the appropriate advance time to turn on the heater to ensure that the set temperature is reached at the set time. For example, if your timer is set to start at 18:00 (6 pm) and temperature is set to 23 °C (73 °F), the fire may for example come on at 17:30 (5:30 pm) to ensure the room is 23 °C at 18:00.

Window Open Detection

When the transmitter detects a rapid drop in room temperature, it will be judged as a window open, the warning icon will be displayed and the heater will be turned off automatically.

After the indoor temperature has risen or a manual override of the warning (by operating remote control) has been done, the fire will return to normal working state.

Important Safety Information for Remote Control

- To remove the batteries, open the back cover of the remote control heandset and replace with new ones. Pay attention to the positive and negative poles.
- Two AAA alkaline batteries are required for the remote control.
- Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the appliance and safely disposed of.

Remote Control

- These non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- Different types of batteries or new and used batteries are not to be mixed.
- Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.
- If the appliance is to be stored unused for a long period, the batteries should be removed.
- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.

Resetting the Thermal Cut Out

The appliance is fitted with an Electric Safety Control (E.S.). This is a safety device, which switches off the fire if, for any reason, the appliance overheats, e.g. when covered. If the heater stops operating while the flame effect continues working normally, this indicates that the E.S. Control is in operation.

The E.S. Control can only be reset after the appliance has cooled down, and the appliance has been reset. To reset the E.S. Control proceed as follow:

- 1. Switch off the appliance (Manual switch) and leave it off for approximatively 10–15 minutes.
- 2. Shut-off the power supply to the appliance at the electric panel or disconnect the appliance's plug from the socket.
- 3. Remove any obstruction to the fan heater outlet or fan blades, etc.
- 4. Reconnect the power and switch on the appliance and the E.S. Control will be reset.
- 5. Ensure the appliance is functioning correctly. If the E.S. Control operates again, the appliance should be checked by a competent electrician.

App Control

Visit your APP store for iOS or Android to download the **C&JsmartFIRE** APP. Or use the QR code on this page. Follow your devices onscreen instructions to create an account. Once installed, follow the procedure below to pair the device with your appliance.

- Start the APP and click "Add Device" on screen. Click "smartFIRE", then select WiFi network and enter the password.
 - NOTE: Your device must also be connected to the same home network that you wish to connect the appliance to.
- 2. Ensure the appliance is powered on, then press and hold the WiFi button on the appliance until you hear 3 beeps at EZ mode. At the same time, the WiFi indicator and the fuel bed will blink.
- 3. Follow the instructions on APP to choose the EZ mode and confirm the indicator is flashing. Click Next and start to add the device.

If failed at EZ mode, try AP mode. Press the WiFi button; you will hear 3 beeps. Keep pressing until you hear another 5 beeps to enter AP mode, and then follow the instructions on APP to choose the AP mode and confirm the indicator is flashing. Click "Go to Connect" and choose a WiFi called "SmaltLife-XXX" and start to add the device.


Abrasive cleaners should not be used on the glass panel.

Liquids should not be sprayed directly onto any surface of the unit.



TWO YEAR LIMITED WARRANTY

Products to which this limited warranty applies

This limited warranty applies to your newly purchased Valor Electric product. This limited warranty applies to the original purchaser of the product only and is not transferable.

Terms & Conditions

Products covered by this limited warranty have been tested and inspected prior to shipment. Subject to the provisions of this warranty, Miles Industries Ltd. (the "Company") warrants such products to be free from defects in material and workmanship for a period of two years from the date of the first purchase.

The Company is not responsible for the labour costs to remove defective parts or reinstall repaired or replacement parts.
